This was the sixth meeting of the Advisory Committee assembled to provide input into the development of the Hardin County Regional Wastewater Facilities Plan.

1. Introductions

Attendees introduced themselves and cited their interest in the development of the plan.

2. Review minutes and action items from last meeting

Mark Sneve reviewed the minutes prepared from the past meeting including Issue Paper No. 6 – Population and Flow Projections. No corrections to the minutes were offered.

3. Issue Paper No. 7 –Flow Projections and Alternatives Development

Mark Sneve reviewed the content of Issue Paper No. 7. The areas of need were assigned into specific watersheds for further consideration in the plan. Then, based on population projections discussed in the previous issue paper, wastewater flows were identified. The matrix of possible treatment locations was filled out by the participants in the meeting. This matrix included potential county WWTPs where appropriate.

A copy of Issue Paper 7 – Resolved is attached to these minutes. The observation was made that the near urban watersheds may develop within the 20 year plan. The advisory Committee agreed to consider the watersheds with identified needs as 0-10 year needs and the near urban watersheds as 10-20 year needs. If areas in the rural watersheds were to develop with a high density it would be beyond the 20 year planning study. The Advisory Committee suggested Flippin Creek watershed be considered a near urban watershed.



A question was raised about the population growth model used in the MPO study and how it compared to the Kentucky State Data Center projections. Mark Sneve agreed to confirm the origin of the MPO projections.

The impact of the BRAC recommendations was discussed. At the current time, the BRAC recommendations will likely result in higher growth rates for the county, especially near the north end of the county. This development further supports using a population prediction of twice the population growth as identified in the MPO study.

4. Open Discussion

Charlie Bryant and Mayor Enyart discussed a meeting held between Elizabethtown and Radcliff concerning future wastewater service areas between the two cities. Generally, the two cities had concluded that the lines previously drawn for planning areas would likely remain good boundaries for future service areas.

5. Action Steps

Mark Sneve will be responsible for preparing minutes from the meeting.  
Mark Sneve will confirm the source of population projections in the MPO Study.

6. Next Meeting
